


Eco-Bricks

What are Ecobricks?

Ecobricks are empty disposable plastic bottles packed with plastic waste. Once compressed, these bottles become hard, and an ideal building material. It is our goal to collect as many completed bricks are possible. After collected we will donate the bricks to an organization called IR4C- a voluntary club of International Relations Faculty at University of Social Sciences and Humanities in Ho Chi Minh. This group is touring around the local secondary schools, to raise environmental awareness and teach students the power of Ecobricking. The students have started their Ecobricking mission last school year, and will carry on with gusto this school year as well. What is STEM?

STEM is a curriculum based on the idea of educating students in four specific disciplines — science, technology, engineering and mathematics — in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. Rather than teach the four disciplines as separate and discrete subjects, STEM integrates them into a cohesive learning paradigm based on real-world applications.

All of this effort is to meet a need. According to a report by the website <u>STEMconnector.org</u>, by 2018, projections estimate the need for 8.65 million workers in STEM-related jobs.

What separates STEM from the traditional science and math education is the blended learning environment and showing students how the scientific method can be applied to everyday life. It teaches students computational thinking and focuses on the real world applications of problem solving.

Our wonderful Head of STEM, Ms. Anna has been working hard to develop STEM lessons for the students. Just last week Ms. Anna trained our teaching staff to incorporate upcycled items for STEM projects, which is both inventive and great for the environment. We are happy to introduce this new learning approach in our school and think the students will enjoy it as well.
