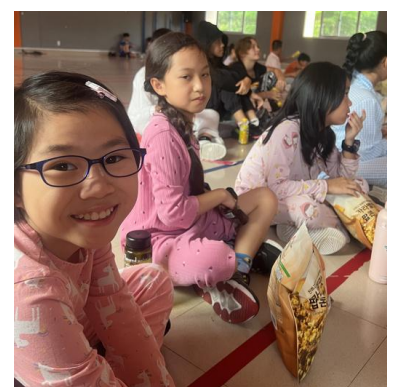

The Children's Day festivities ended with a magic show!

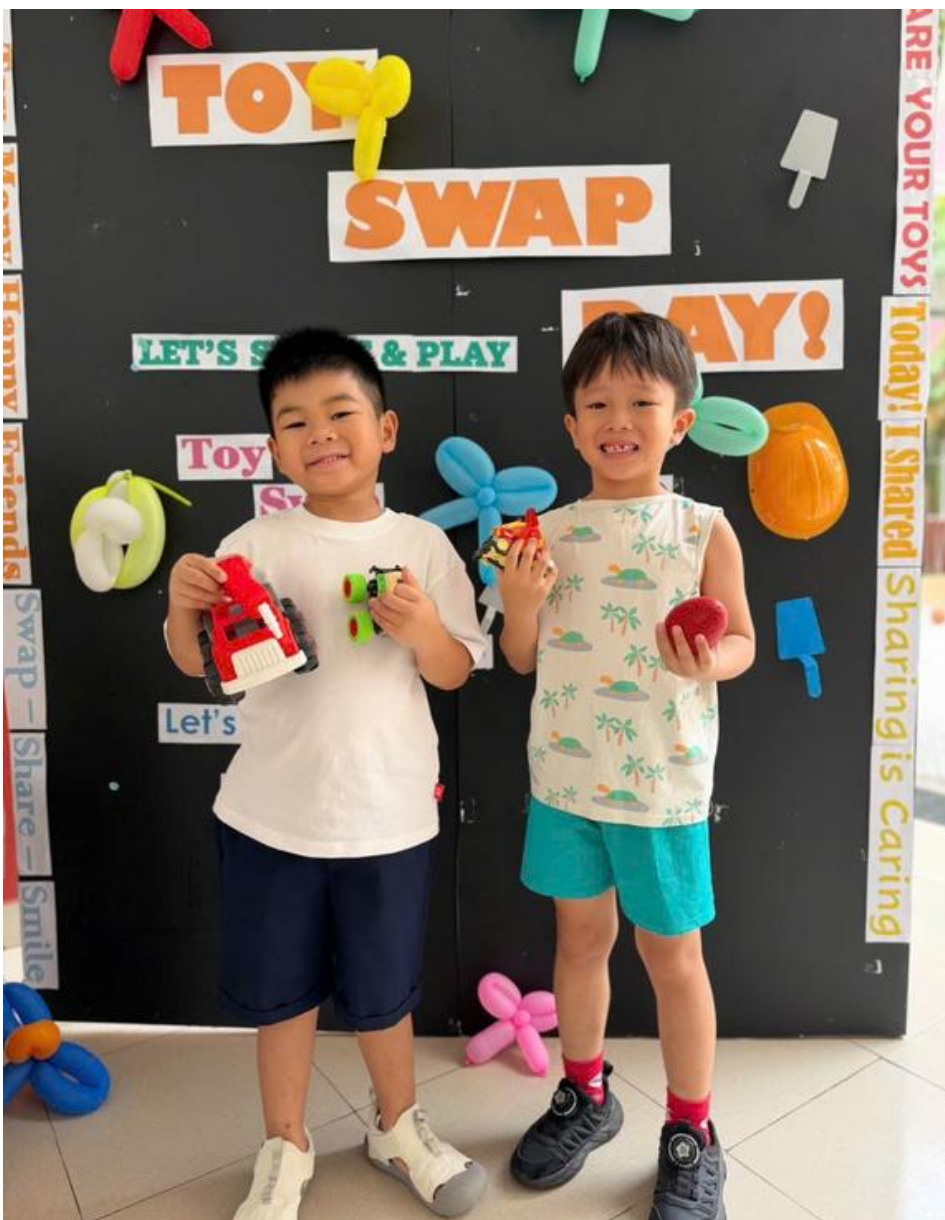

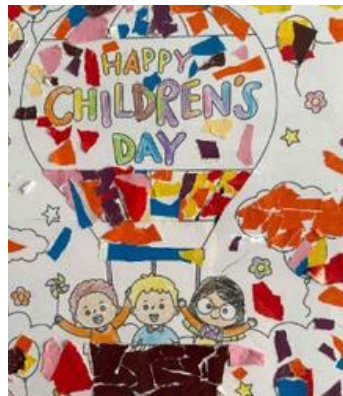

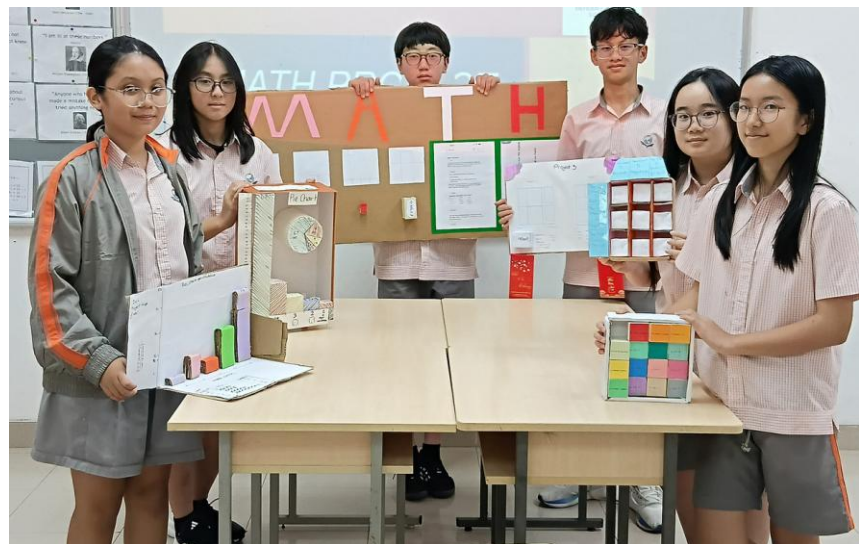
