Recently, we have been learning about **Trigonometric Ratios**. We have learnt how to use the “**sin**” “**cos**” “**tan**” functions on our calculators. These functions help us to find the angles and sides of a triangle. Geometry allow us to integrate the things that we have learnt from the lessons into our daily life. We really enjoy gaining more knowledge about this chapter.



Singapore International Mastery Contest


