In the end, this lunar mission rehearsal wasn't just about dancing, it was about landing smiles, sharing culture, and proving that practice really does make perfect.







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## ***Primary Music***



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At the Ba Ria Thermal Power Plant, students received direct guidance from engineers, who introduced them to the electricity production process and how to use electricity safely and efficiently. What might seem like dry scientific knowledge became engaging through practical experience, helping them broaden their understanding, foster a love of learning, and cultivate a sense of environmental responsibility. Furthermore, the scientific concepts in textbooks were vividly illustrated through real-world experiences, expanding students' knowledge, and fostering STEM thinking.

The class was commended for their enthusiasm and professionalism, noting that the project successfully brought learning beyond the textbook and encouraged meaningful cultural appreciation through food.






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## *News from KIK*


