Exam details will be emailed to all parents very shortly. It is very important that, over the holidays, your child revisits some of the work they have completed this year. Here are some great exam tips for your child:

- **Remember your pencils/pens!** Such an obvious thing, but surprising how many forget.
- **Read the instructions**: Always read each question carefully and always go back to the question after you have finished.
- Finish the whole paper: Another obvious one but don't forget there is a back page!
- **Sleep well:** Very important to sleep well before the exam. Don't stay up late on the computer the night before as this will deter your concentration.
- Answer all the questions: Please attempt all questions and even if you don't know the answer, always have a good guess especially on questions which have multiple answers.
