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Read Aloud Day 2016

Our annual Read Aloud Day was held in May this year and was themed around, quite aptly, stories. We decided to also combine Read Aloud Day with the annual tea and cake sale which last year raised an incredible 18m VND.

In the morning, there was a special Assembly dedicated to reading stories and Ms Catherine's Year 1 class and Ms Su's Year 3 class read some nice stories out to the rest of the school. Following Assembly, the main activity was for the students to create a BIG book in their houses groups. The students collaborated in their houses a few days earlier and came up with a story for their big book. Then, on Read Aloud Day they got together and created a HUGE book which had pictures and text. All the students from Year 1 to IGCSE helped make the book. Some students coloured in, some directed and some drew pictures. The end result was 4 BIG books that were read out to the school.

After all the excitement of book making, the students prepared the annual tea and cake sale. This year we raised money for the local orphanages in Ba Ria and Long Hai. Similar to last year, we asked parents to donate a cake or two to the school and then the students sold them to everyone after school. This year we had some lovely individually made cakes from Lucia's Dad (Café Nine Bistro) and some yummy éclairs from Matvey. The student council did a terrific job in organizing the whole event and they were sweating by the end of the day. We sold all the cakes this year and raised about 12m VND! Another great effort from everyone involved.

What was the reason for all this fundraising? We decided that the local orphanages should receive equal donations so we bought supplies for the Long Hai Educational and Skills Centre run by Daniel's mother. In return, they performed an amazing show of martial arts to our students. They were so good that even the teachers looked a little scared whilst watching them perform their moves. As you can see from the pictures, we bought them a range of kitchen items from rice cookers to eating trays. Ms Huong also showed around the Year 3 students from their school so our students could see how things work there. Ms Anna also enjoyed the tour and learned about how our school raises money for the local centers.

Thank you to all the parents who have helped raise money throughout the year. We will be doing the same next school year and would really appreciate your time and help.
