DYNED CERTIFICATES



Last week, many students from SIS VT were given DynEd certificates for their hard work and commitment to the program. These students have successfully completed their study level and moved on to the next one. As a result, certificates were passed out as qualifications for completing their level. These certificates were directly issued by DynEd headquarters themselves in California, USA. They are proof of the students' fluency in English.

Anyone can get a DynEd certificate if they are willing to put in the hard work. Students just need to do the program for 30 minutes every day for 5 days every week. During this studying process, the students need to stay committed by using all of the program's functions (e.g repeating, voice recording, listen to the record, etc). Their study score will improve as a reward for following these steps correctly. Maintaining a good study score helps the students to progress through the study level faster. By the end, they will need to finish at least 80% for all of the modules and pass an exit exam to gain the certificate.

Working on DynEd will always gain more than just a certificate as it is our goal to build English skills to support our students with their future endeavors. We hope that our students will continue their hard work and always do their best.

SECONDARY ENGLISH



This year Secondary English students have been utilizing a range of constructive displays and learning mats. These help to scaffold the usage of structural language like connectives, verbs, adverbs and adjectives to name but a few. The displays act as 'stations' that the students can visit for help at key points in writing production. The learning mats give individual help at their tables. Along with teacher direction this leads to greater fluency in writing as students memorize language structures and begin to intuitively apply them in their work.

HOUR OF CODE



Student in year 4 and 5 received their certificates for participation in the hour of code. Hour of Code is a global initiative in over 180 countries. It is designed to be an introduction to coding for younger students. As part of the hour of code students are learn about coding using lots of fun activities. The hour of code is designed to demystify coding and make it more accessible to students.







ORPHANAGE DONATIONS



As an annual tradition, the IGCSE students will represent the entire school by visiting a local orphanage in our area. Unlike the previous years, they did not visit the children during Christmas, but instead, are visiting during Tet.

Tet is the most important holiday for all Vietnamese citizens, because it is the time for families to reunite and celebrate. However, these children are not as fortunate, since they do not have the same opportunity as others.
