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## SIS Students Help Name Bald Eagle Chicks in U.S. Wildlife Project

Students at SIS@Vung Tau recently took part in a special international conservation activity—helping name two newly hatched bald eagle chicks in Big Bear Valley, California. This project, livestreamed by the non-profit *Friends of Big Bear Valley (FOBBV)*, follows a famous pair of bald eagles named Jackie and Shadow. After two years of unsuccessful nesting seasons, Jackie and Shadow successfully hatched three eggs this year, with two eaglets surviving—a rare and exciting moment for eagle watchers around the world.

Inspired by the project, one of our teachers, who has been following the nest with students for the past three years, invited SIS students to join the official naming contest. Classes across the school submitted name suggestions, which were narrowed down to a top 10: Cookie, Shady, Cloudy, Hunter, Gravy, Biscuit, Casper, Baldy, Aura, and Butter Balls. Year 3 to Year 5 students then voted, and the winning names were **Aura** and **Biscuit**.

Our chosen names, along with a donation from teachers on behalf of SIS@Vung Tau, have now been submitted to FOBBV. In a fun twist introduced by our school, students believed they were voting for just two final names to submit—mirroring the process that will soon take place in California. However, all 10 of our school's selected names will actually be submitted for the official naming contest due to the donation received. FOBBV will randomly select the names from the lists provided by schools and private donations from around the world, including SIS, and the final two names will be chosen by Grade 3–5 students at Big Bear Valley Elementary School on April 1st, 2025.

This activity has not only deepened our students' understanding of wildlife conservation and the fragility of species like the bald eagle, but it also created a meaningful bridge between communities across the globe and aligns with one of our School Wide Learner Goals of creating Active and Responsible Citizens. Jackie and Shadow are well-known figures in their local area and are often featured on the news, making this a unique opportunity for SIS students to engage with real-world science and global citizenship.

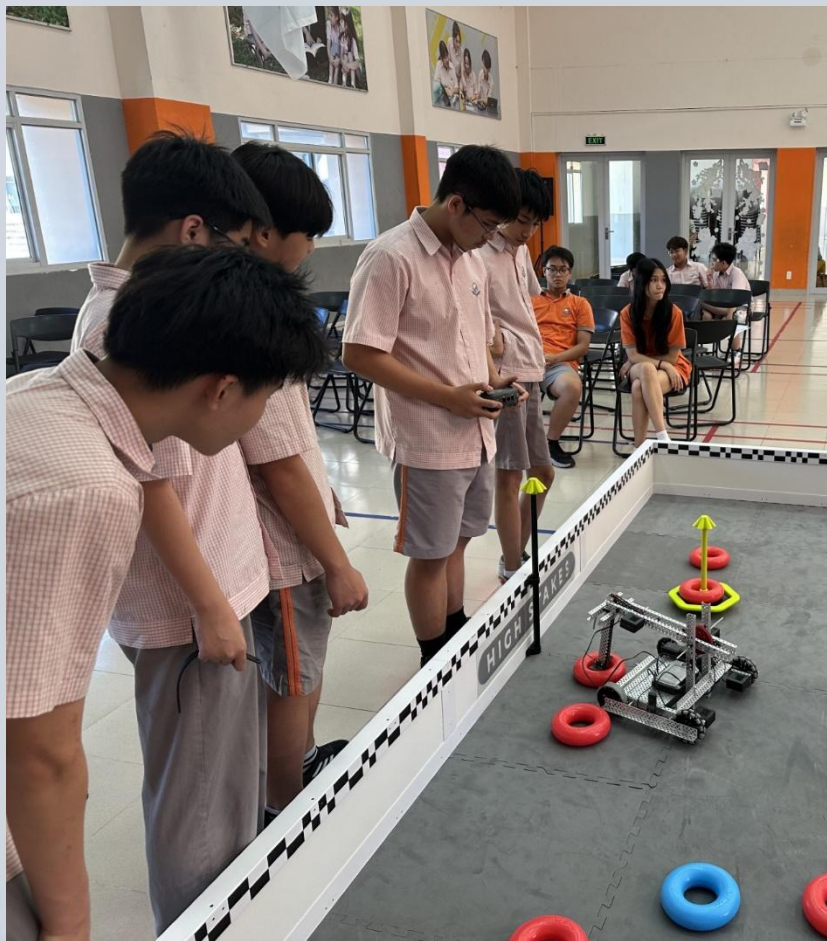
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## Students Gear Up for New VEX Robotics Challenge
